Global Volunteering July 2020

Research and examples of global volunteering have been provided by the CECP team below.

CECP INSIGHTS

CECP's <u>Giving in Numbers: 2019 Edition</u> cited that 36% of companies offered virtual volunteering opportunities to domestic employees, while 18% did so for international employees.





CECP's Giving in Numbers: 2019 Edition found that Paid-Release Time and Flexible Scheduling were the most offered domestic and international volunteer programs in 2018. These two programs were the ones that increased the most (+5 percentage points) in terms of the percentage of companies offering them to their international employees between 2016 and 2018 in a three-year matched set of companies.

OVERVIEW OF VIRTUAL VOLUNTEERISM

As a response to COVID-19, many companies have turned to virtual volunteering—also known as online volunteering, remote volunteering, or e-volunteering—to continue their employees' philanthropic efforts. To volunteer means to give of yourself (time, talent, and/or treasure) in service to a cause. It is wide ranging and can encompass small acts of kindness, such as handwriting letters of encouragement or picking up groceries for an elderly neighbor to more large scale projects, such as offering financial literacy webinars to underserved communities or signing up to be a UN Volunteer. Best company practices of encouraging volunteering online include reviewing and rethinking internal policies and processes related to community engagement, providing virtual and remote volunteer opportunities, and ensuring employees are receiving recognition of their work. While virtual volunteering is often practiced locally, there are global volunteer opportunities for employees to partake in as well. Below you will find many examples of global volunteering.
